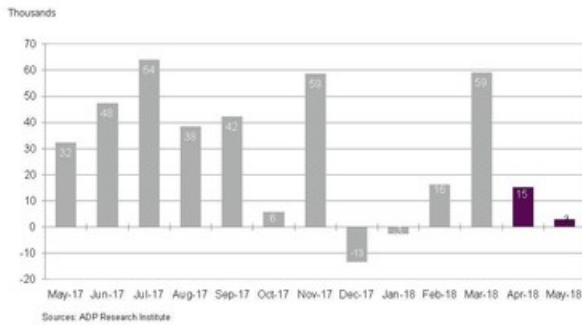


ADP Canada National Employment Report: Employment in Canada Increased by 2,900 Jobs in May 2018

TORONTO, June 21, 2018 /CNW/ -- Employment in Canada increased by 2,900 jobs from April to May according to the May *ADP® Canada National Employment Report*. Broadly distributed to the public each month, free of charge, the *ADP Canada National Employment Report* is produced by the ADP Research Institute®. The report, which is derived from actual ADP payroll data, measures the change in total nonfarm payroll employment each month on a seasonally-adjusted basis.

"Job growth in Canada slowed in the month of May," said Ahu Yildirmaz, vice president and co-head of the ADP Research Institute. "While construction and trade were detractors from the overall growth, we saw improved growth in information, education, and leisure and hospitality."

Chart 2. Historical Trend – Change in Total Nonfarm Payroll Employment

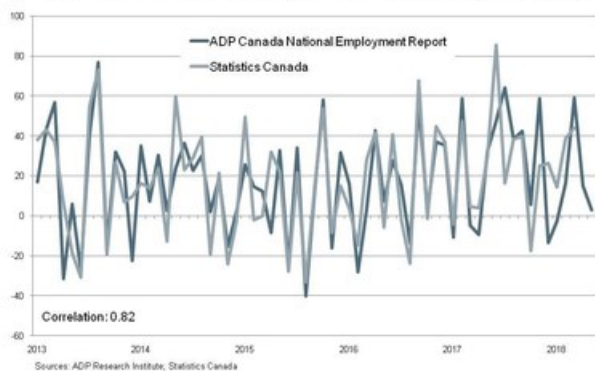
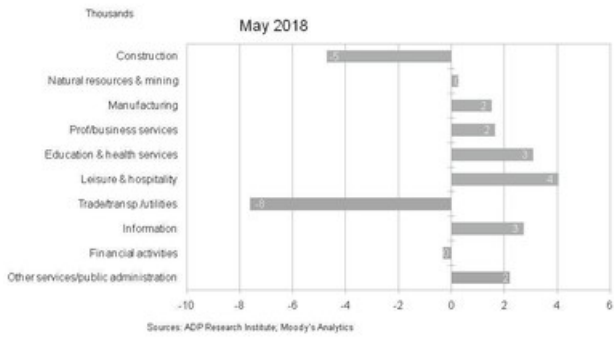


Chart 3. Change in Nonfarm Payroll Employment by Industry
