TORONTO, Feb. 21, 2019 /CNW/ -- Employment in Canada increased by 35,400 jobs from December to January according to the January *ADP*[®] *Canada National Employment Report*. Broadly distributed to the public each month, free of charge, the *ADP Canada National Employment Report* is produced by the ADP Research Institute[®]. The report, which is derived from actual ADP payroll data, measures the change in total nonfarm payroll employment each month on a seasonally-adjusted basis.

"2019 is off to a strong start," said Ahu Yildirmaz, vice president and co-head of the ADP Research Institute. "While there was a slowdown in education and healthcare, all other industries performed very well. Trade had a significant increase in employment,

accounting for approximately one third of all jobs added this month."

The December total of jobs added was revised down from -13.000 to -20.900.




