# **ADP Canada National Employment Report: Employment in Canada Increased by 61,700 Jobs in April 2019**

TORONTO, May 16, 2019 /CNW/ -- Employment in Canada increased by 61,700 jobs from March to April according to the April ADP® Canada National Employment Report. Broadly distributed to the public each month, free of charge, the ADP Canada National Employment Report is produced by the ADP Research Institute<sup>®</sup>. The report, which is derived from actual ADP payroll data, measures the change in total nonfarm payroll employment each month on a seasonally-adjusted basis.

The March total of jobs added was revised up from 13,200 to 76,700.




Chart 2. Historical Trend - Change in Total Nonfarm Payroll Employment
