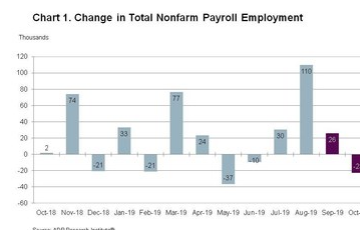


ADP Canada National Employment Report: Employment in Canada Decreased by 22,600 Jobs in October 2019

TORONTO, Nov. 21, 2019 /CNW/ -- Employment in Canada decreased by 22,600 jobs from September to October according to the October *ADP® Canada National Employment Report*. Broadly distributed to the public each month, free of charge, the *ADP Canada National Employment Report* is produced by the ADP Research Institute®. The report, which is derived from actual ADP payroll data, measures the change in total nonfarm payroll employment each month on a seasonally-adjusted basis.

"The labor market paused in October and most job sectors posted declines," said Ahu Yildirmaz, vice president and co-head of the ADP Research Institute. "However, leisure and hospitality experienced a gain likely due to the seasonality nature of the industry."

The September total of jobs added was revised down from 28,200 to 25,700.

The November 2019 *ADP Canada National Employment Report* will be released at 8:30a.m.ET on December 19, 2019.

The *ADP Canada National Employment Report* is a monthly measure of the change in total Canada nonfarm payroll employment derived from actual, anonymous payroll data of client companies served by ADP Canada. 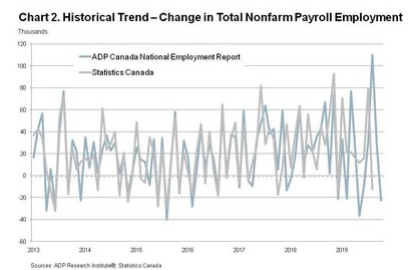
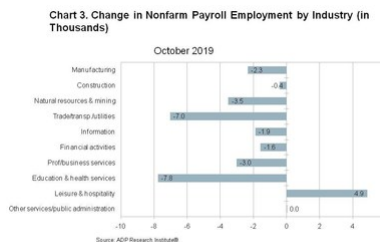
